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Summary

- **Reported Crimes:** Major reported crimes decreased 7.5% in Davidson County from 2020 to 2021. Violent crimes increased 4.1% while property crimes decreased 10.8% (page 3).
- **Arrests:** In 2021 adult physical arrests increased 10.4% above 2020. State Citation arrests decreased 27.0% below 2020 (page 4).
- **Arrests by Gender:** males were 75.9% of physical arrests and females were 24.1% in 2021. Males were 67.9% of State Citations while females were 32.1% (page 4).
- **Arrests by Race:** In 2021, Whites comprised 50.3% of physical arrests while Blacks comprised 48.6%. Whites were 58.5% of citation arrests and Blacks were 38.2% (page 6).
- **Arrests by Ethnicity:** Hispanics were 9.0% and Non-Hispanics were 91.0% of physical arrests in 2021. Hispanics were 28.3% of citation arrests while Non-Hispanics made up 70.9% (page 7).
- **Arrest Rates:** Davidson County saw 2,476 physical arrests per 100,000 residents in 2021; State citations were issued at the rate of 856 per 100,000 residents (page 9).
- **Bond Releases:** Overall, bond releases increased 5.9% in 2021. Releases to bonding companies were 54.0% of all bond types and increased 0.05%. Pretrial releases were 30.0% of bonds and increased 7.7% (page 10).
- **Bond Set Amount:** The average bond set amount for all charges increased from \$9,822 in 2020 to \$10,735 in 2021. The average amount for a felony was \$26,485 and \$1,834 for a misdemeanor (page 11).
- **Days In Jail Before Release:** In 2021, defendants spent an average of 12.42 days in jail before release for a felony and 1.90 days for a misdemeanor (page 13).
- **Percent Who Posted Bond:** In 2021, 68.7% of defendants posted bond before release. 31.3% were released without posting bond (charges disposed) (page 15).
- **General Sessions Court Volume:** General Sessions Court processed 1.2% fewer defendants with a new filing in 2021 compared to 2020. General Sessions Court concluded 15.9% more defendants and bound over 10.3% more defendants to Criminal Court (pages 18-19).
- **Criminal Court Volume:** Criminal Court processed 4.2% fewer defendants with new filings in 2021. There were 2.6% fewer defendants disposed. Criminal Court had 0.9 % more defendants with probation violation filings and 1.8% fewer defendants with probation violations disposed in 2021 compared to 2020 (pages 20-21).
- **General Sessions Case Processing Times:** On average, the time needed to process defendants in General Sessions Court in 2021 was 198.0 days, a 61.5% increase over 2020. Average time from arrest to bound over was 143.3 days, while arrest to disposition was 212.2 days. Jailed defendants averaged 18.1 days to conclusion. Bond defendants averaged 278.7 days to conclusion (pages 22-23).
- **Criminal Court Case Processing Times:** In 2021 the average time to process defendants from bound over to filing in Criminal Court was 82.6 days, an increase of 11.9% over 2020. From filing to disposition in Criminal Court took 381.3 days on average, a 36.9% increase. Cases disposed by trial averaged 1,026.1 days from filing to disposition in 2021. Jailed defendants took 277.7 days, while bond defendants took 439.1 days from filing in Criminal Court to disposition (pages 24-27).

- **ADP:** The average daily inmate population in Davidson County correctional facilities declined from 1,746 in 2020 to 1,565 in 2021, a 10.4% decline (page 28).
- **ADP by Gender:** Males comprised 89.6% of the ADP in 2021 while females made up 10.4% (page 29).
- **ADP by Race:** By race, 38.9% of the 2021 ADP was White, and 60.1% was Black (page 30).
- **ADP by Ethnicity:** 93.0% of the 2021 ADP was non-Hispanic; 6.9% were Hispanic (page 31).
- **ADP by Age:** The largest inmate age group was 21-44, representing 72.5% of the total inmate population (page 32).
- **ADP by Charge Classification:** The largest inmate charge class in the 2021 ADP was Pretrial Felons, who comprised 46.6% of the total and increased 3.6% above 2020 levels. Pretrial Misdemeanants were 3.5% of the total and increased 5.8%. Locally Sentenced Felons were the second largest group, with 18.6% of the total ADP, and decreased 22.1% (pages 33-36).
- **ADP by Charge Classification--Federal Inmates:** DHS/ICE inmates declined 62.4% to almost 0 in the 2021 ADP. As of December 2019, DCSO announced it would no longer contract to house DHS/ICE detainees. Other Federal inmates, such as those detained for the United States Marshal Service, decreased 12.8% in 2021, accounting for 3.1% of the total ADP (page 37).
- **ADP by Most Serious Arrested Charge:** 47.0% of the 2021 ADP had an Offense Against Person as their most serious charge. This was the largest category and included Homicides, Robberies, Assaults, and Rapes. Motor Vehicle Offenses (comprised mostly of DUI offenses) increased 23.1% over 2020, while all other categories declined. Criminal Homicide was the single largest arrested charge, accounting for 7.6% of the 2021 ADP (page 38).
- **Incarceration Rates:** Davidson County incarcerated 222.4 inmates (including locally sentenced felons) per 100,000 residents in 2021, more than Knox County at 192.9 and Rutherford County at 210.9, but fewer than Hamilton County at 291.0 and Shelby County at 380.7. When the locally sentenced felons are removed, Davidson County's incarceration rate drops to 176.3 for 2021 (page 39).
- **Juveniles:** There were no juveniles incarcerated in the adult correctional system in 2021. DCSO and Juvenile Detention worked out an agreement where, as of July 2015, Juvenile Detention houses juveniles who have been adjudicated as adults. There were 7 juveniles transferred to the adult system from Juvenile Court in 2021, a 30.0% decline from 2020 (page 40).

(a) The Crime Index is comprised of seven offense categories: Homicide, Rape, Aggravated Assault, Robbery, Burglary, Larceny, and Vehicle Theft. These offenses make up the Uniform Crime Reporting standards for reporting and comparing the crime index for U.S. cities.

(b) According to page 2 of the Metropolitan Police Department's Annual Crime Analysis Report of CY 2021 Crime Statistics, in 2012, the FBI changed the Uniform Crime Report (UCR) definition of rape. In addition to forcible rape, the new definition also includes forcible sodomy and sexual assault with an object and it includes males. This new definition became effective 01/01/2013, but was implemented by MNPD in 2012.

TOTAL AND GENDER






ETHNICITY





NOTES FOR TABLES 7-9:

- 1) Data includes all defendants with warrants on new cases filed in General Sessions Court. Felony and misdemeanor arrested charges are included. Each defendant represents a single person and all charges filed against that person at the time the person is taken into custody. Bond and case disposition data are accurate as of the date the data was pulled. Defendants with an incomplete bond status as of the data pull date are excluded from the analysis. Therefore, defendants in this report have either posted bond or had their charges disposed. Defendants bound over to Criminal Court are included only if they have posted bond or been disposed in Criminal Court.
- 2) The charge type (felony, misdemeanor) and charge classification are determined using the most serious arrested charge for the defendant at case filing date. Civil charges are included in the total but excluded in the detail lists.
- 3) Bond information is determined using Bond Set, Bond Reset, and Bond Post events and bond payment tables in CJIS.
- 4) Bond Set: Monetary bond amounts are at the defendant level. Bond set amounts are the sum of all bonds set for all charges pending when the defendant is brought into custody. The bond amount set is the amount that is forfeited if the defendant fails to appear in court or to comply with the conditions of the bond. In situations where the bond amount is reset than the reset amount is used in this report.
- 5) Bond Post: In Davidson County, after a defendant is arrested and brought to custody a commissioner sets a bail bond amount. Once the bond is set, the accused can pay the cash amount, obtain a property bond, get released to the Pretrial program, get released on their own recognizance (ROR), or hire a professional bond company (surety bond).
- 6) No Bond Posted: The defendant's charges were disposed, and no bond was posted prior to disposition. A small number were released prior to disposition without posting bond at the discretion of the court.
- 7) Days in Jail: Calculated using the number of days in jail from case filing to jail release upon posting bond. If no bond was posted, we used the number of days in jail from case filing to case disposition. If the defendant was bound over to Criminal Court, jail days included all days from case filing in General Sessions Court up to bond posting or disposition while in Criminal Court.
- 8) Statistics on bond amounts and jail days were calculated using values within 2 standard deviations + or - the mean to remove extreme values. Two standard deviations around the mean account for approximately 95% of the data population.

CASE PROCESSING TIMES IN CRIMINAL COURT 2012 – 2021





CASE PROCESSING TIMES IN CRIMINAL COURT 2012 – 2021





Averages were calculated using values that fell within 2 standard deviations from the mean, to exclude extreme values. Two standard deviations account for approximately 95% of the data.
- (d) Trial Status is defined as Trial when the case was recorded in CJIS as disposed with disposition by either jury trial or bench trial.
- (e) Jail status is determined by counting the number of days the defendant spent in custody until the charges were disposed. Jail status is defined as Jail when a defendant was incarcerated the majority of days (>50%) from filing to disposition in Criminal Court.
