MOVE

This \$104 million drawdown marks a major milestone, moving us from planning to building visible progress across all four voter-approved priorities: **sidewalks, signals, service, and safety.**

SIDEWALKS

\$31.4M

Sidewalk design, engineering, and construction to connect residents in 10 neighborhoods to major transit routes, providing them safe, easy connections that are accessible to all users.

SIGNALS

Signals - Fiber

\$11.5M

Design, construction, and implementation of fiber communication network, hardware, and traffic network head-end and control equipment, which are critical components for countywide traffic signal upgrades to support faster, more reliable transit service and commutes for all users.

Signals - Technology

\$20.9M

Planning, engineering, construction, and implementation of smart signal technology at 115 intersections and advanced traffic management system software, which is essential for retrofitting 592 signalized intersections across the county.

ALL-ACCESS CORRIDORS

\$3.2M

Planning, design, engineering, and implementation of All-Access Corridors, including planning and design for Gallatin/Main and Nolensville Pikes. Design and engagement for West End Ave Curbside Bus Lane Pilot. All-Access Corridors improve service along Nashville's busiest transit routes.

SERVICE

Transit Stops and Shelter Improvements

\$5.0M

Planning, design, and implementation of various improvements to transit stops and shelters, including an enhanced airport transit station and connections.

Bus Fleet Expansion

\$8.6M

Bus fleet expansion to support increased transit service. 40-foot buses with delivery anticipated in 2027/2028. Additional fleet is essential to delivering CHYM service expansion.

Bus Operations & Maintenance Facility

\$10.0M

Planning and site acquisition for a new bus operations and maintenance facility, supporting expansion of WeGo services beyond the currently at-capacity operations and maintenance facilities. The facility is fundamental to future growth of the transit system.

SAFETY

Complete Streets

\$11.8M

Reconstruction for Edgehill/Chestnut Street from 21st Ave. to Lafayette Street to improve safety and connectivity for transit and transit users, whether they're walking, biking, or driving to their transit stop. The funding also supports planning and design for mobility lanes at Union, 7th, and Demonbreun downtown to help bicyclists and scooters connect to major transit destinations safely.

Transit Safety Division Fleet

\$1.7M

Safety and security upgrades for the new Transit Safety Division within MNPd.

SIDEWALKS:

Benton Avenue

- Construction from Bransford Avenue to existing sidewalk.

Fort Negley Boulevard

- Construction from Chestnut Street to Bass Street.

SIGNALS:

Nolensville-Harding Signalized Intersections Upgrades

- Upgrade 32 intersections from the downtown interstate loop to Harding Place on 2nd/4th Avenues/Nolensville Pike and from Nolensville Pike to I-24 on Harding Place with new technology to connect into Traffic Management Center.

Traffic Management Center

- Technology upgrades to the network and software in Metro's Traffic Management Center for future expansion, to better service traffic management of all modes, including transit.

SAFETY:

Edgehill/Chestnut Complete Street

- Safe connection to transit between Lafayette and 21st Ave Construction funded Fall 2025.

WeGo Public Transit Security Upgrades

- Increases contracted hours with WeGo's security firm; allows for appointment of first Transit Liaison within Metro-Nashville Police Dept. Captain Brian Williams started March 1. 
- Building space planning and vehicle purchases for safety and security upgrades. 

SERVICE:

52 Nolensville Pike Service Upgrade

- Antioch Pike between Nolensville Pike and Glencliff High School twice a day on school days.

55 Murfreesboro Pike Service Upgrades

- Weekday evening frequency improvements upgraded from 20 minutes to 15 minutes. Effective July 6, 2025.
- Weekend frequency improvements upgraded from 20 minutes to 15 minutes (6 am to 6 pm), and from 20-30 minutes to 15 minutes (weekend evenings). Effective July 6, 2025.

WeGo Access on Demand Service Upgrades

- Add service on Saturdays (4:45 am to 1 am) and Sundays/Holidays (4:45 am to 11 pm). Effective May 31, 2025.

Journey Pass Program

- An income eligibility-based program providing free transit services for qualifying residents. In development with pilot phase launching in late 2025.

New Bus Operations and Maintenance Facility

- Planning for a new, expanded operations and maintenance facility to accommodate service expansion. Site selection & facility programming; some funds budgeted for land acquisition.

Bus Fleet Expansion

- 12 new buses to support increased service levels. Some funds budgeted in Fall 2025.

Airport Service Upgrades

- Planning for improvements to airport transit rider experience.
